

| 1   | <b>Feb. 2<br/>Saturday</b> | Depart Dallas to Newark on flight AA 2736 at 12:40pm.  | en route  |
| 2   | <b>Feb. 3<br/>Sunday</b>   | Arrive at Ben Gurion Airport in Tel Aviv on flight LY 026 at 2:20pm. After passport control and baggage claim, we’ll meet our guide, Reuben, and travel to Netanya. We can rest and enjoy the beautiful beach front on the Mediterranean.  | Netanya,<br>Ramada or<br>similar                        |
| 3   | <b>Feb. 4<br/>Monday</b>   | We’ll begin the day with a brief stop at <b>Israel College of the Bible</b> to learn about the current Messianic movement in Israel. Continue to the impressive port of <b>Caesarea</b> . Here Cornelius received the gospel (Acts 10), Roman governors such as Pilate, Felix (Acts 24) and Festus (Acts 26) ruled, and Paul made his defense before King Agrippa. Visit <b>Mt. Carmel</b> , site of Elijah’s contest with the prophets of Baal, and eat lunch at a Druze restaurant (not included). Passing the Old Testament city of <b>Megiddo</b> , from which we get “Armageddon” of Rev. 16:16, we will visit the <b>Harod Spring</b> , where Gideon tested his men (Judges 7). We will continue to <b>Nazareth</b> , and visit the “Synagogue Church,” to discuss Jesus’ presentation of Himself as Messiah (Luke 4:14ff). Time permitting, we’ll end the day with a visit to <b>Cana</b> on our way to the Sea of Galilee. | Tiberias,<br>Emily’s<br>Boutique<br>Hotel or<br>similar |
| 4   | <b>Feb. 5<br/>Tuesday</b>  | Begin the day with a boat ride on the <b>Sea of Galilee</b> and view the ancient fishing boat from the time of Yeshua, found by the shore of the plain of Gennesaret. |   |                            | Galilee: visiting <b>Tabgha</b> , Peter's fishing place; <b>Capernaum</b> , Jesus' ministry base; and the <b>Mount of Beatitudes</b> , traditional site of the Sermon on the Mount (Matt. 5-7). Enjoy a <b>fish lunch</b> together near the Sea of Galilee (included). In the afternoon, visit <b>Magdala</b> , Mary Magdalene's hometown, and end the day with an ascent of <b>Mt. Arbel</b> , for a panoramic view over the lake.  | <b>Hotel or similar</b>   |
| 5 | <b>Feb. 6<br/>Wed.</b>     | Today, we head north and begin the day with a nature hike at <b>Tel Dan</b> , arriving at one of the altars where Jeroboam set up the golden calf (1 Kings 12), and will see the city gates from the time of Abraham and of King Ahab. Continue to <b>Caesarea Philippi</b> , site of Jesus' question to his disciples: "Who do men say that I am?" (Matt. 16). In the afternoon, ascend the <b>Golan Heights</b> where we will have a view into Syria. If time permits, stop for a birds-eye view over the historic ruins at <b>Gamla</b> , the "Masada of the North."  | <b>Tiberias<br/>Emily's<br/>Boutique<br/>Hotel or<br/>similar</b> |
| 6 | <b>Feb. 7<br/>Thursday</b> | Explore the remains of <b>Beth Shean</b> , one of oldest cities in Israel, on whose gates the bodies of Saul and his sons were hung (1 Samuel 31). Later, it became one of the great Decapolis cities, <b>Scythopolis</b> . Farther south, visit the fords of the <b>Jordan River</b> . Explore <b>Qumran</b> , where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found. Continue along the Dead Sea shore (the lowest elevation on earth) and take a short hike at the oasis of <b>Ein Gedi</b> , where David hid from Saul. In the late afternoon you'll have a chance to float in the mineral-rich waters of the <b>Dead Sea</b> , the lowest point on earth.   | <b>Dead Sea<br/>region,<br/>Prima Oasis<br/>or similar</b>        |
| 7 | <b>Feb. 8<br/>Friday</b>   | Ride the cable car up to <b>Masada</b> , where the last Jewish defenders held out against the Romans. After an explanation of the site, we will descend the Roman Ramp on foot and travel through the Negev, with its varied ethnic communities. We'll stop at the "Fountain of Tears," an artistic juxtaposition of the Crucifixion and the Holocaust created by a Messianic sculptor living in <b>Arad</b> . Explore <b>Tel Sheva</b> , the ancient mound of Biblical Beer Sheva, where Abraham made his home and planted a tamarisk tree (Genesis 21:33). Continue to the Judean lowlands, stopping at the Elah Valley, where <b>David fought Goliath</b> , and then ascend to <b>Jerusalem</b> , for our first glimpse of the Holy City. | 8  | <b>Feb. 9</b><br><b>Saturday</b> | From the top of the <b>Mount of Olives</b> we will begin the day with a breathtaking panorama over the Old City of Jerusalem. As you descend, remember that Jesus often travelled this route and taught his disciples along the way (Matt 24, 25). We'll pause in the gardens of " <b>Dominus Flevit</b> " and remember his weeping over the city in the midst of his triumphal entry. We'll also take some time to meditate in the <b>Garden of Gethsemane</b> . Entering the Old City, visit the <b>Pools of Bethesda</b> (John 5), where Jesus healed the man who had been paralyzed for 38 years. Take a walking tour of the Old City, both the <b>Muslim and Christian quarters</b> , including the "Via Dolorosa" and the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. End the day at the <b>Garden Tomb</b> , a peaceful place for our group to reflect on the Lord's death and resurrection.    | <b>Jerusalem,</b><br><b>Prima Kings</b><br><b>Hotel or</b><br><b>similar</b> |
| 9  | <b>Feb. 10</b><br><b>Sunday</b>  | Tour the <b>City of David</b> , the earliest part of Jerusalem, which David conquered from the Jebusites. After viewing the audiovisual introduction, we will consider the account of Jeremiah in the cistern (Jeremiah 38) and explore the ancient water system, <b>the Pool of Siloam</b> , as well as the Royal Cemetery, where the Kings of Judah were buried. Next, we will see a little of "underground" Jerusalem on a tour of the <b>Western Wall Tunnel</b> . In the afternoon, we'll visit <b>Bethlehem</b> .  | <b>Jerusalem,</b><br><b>Prima Kings</b><br><b>Hotel or</b><br><b>similar</b> |
| 10 | <b>Feb. 11</b><br><b>Monday</b>  | Today, we'll visit <b>Temple Mount</b> , where the Temples of Solomon and Herod once stood, where the church was birthed, and where now the Muslim shrines of the Dome of the Rock and the Al-Aqsa Mosque stand. Visit <b>the Jewish Quarter</b> , viewing the extensive archaeological excavations that have unearthed a wall built by King Hezekiah, mansions from the time of Jesus (housed in the <b>Wohl Museum</b> ), and the <b>Davidson Center</b> , Herod's monumental entranceway to the Temple. Spend time on the location of the " <b>Upper Room</b> ." Lunch in the Jewish Quarter. In the afternoon we'll visit the <b>Israel Museum</b> , which houses the <b>Dead Sea Scrolls</b> and a scale <b>model of Jerusalem</b> at the time of Jesus. In addition, the archaeological wing holds most of the important artifacts unearthed since the establishment of the State. | <b>Jerusalem,</b><br><b>Prima Kings</b><br><b>Hotel or</b><br><b>similar</b> |
| 11 | <b>Feb. 12</b><br><b>Tuesday</b> | This morning we'll have the opportunity to take a walking tour to the <b>Mahane Yehuda market</b> , for a delightful taste of modern Jerusalem. In the afternoon we'll tour <b>Yad Vashem, Israel's Holocaust Museum</b> . Enjoy a farewell dinner together and then transfer to Ben Gurion airport  | <b>en route</b>  |

### RATE DOES NOT INCLUDE:

- ✓ Transportation to Dallas to join the group flight
- ✓ Medical and Travel Insurance for the entire tour, including airfare costs.
- ✓ Passport and visa fees, if applicable
- ✓ Lunches (except on day 4), and other expenses not mentioned in the itinerary.
- ✓ Dinners at the hotels do not usually include beverages.

### BOOKINGS AND RATES

Changes can occur in hotels due to factors beyond our control. In addition, there could be changes in price, due to exchange rate fluctuations prior to the final payment date. The price is based on a group of 20 paying participants.

### PAYMENT AND CANCELLATION PENALTIES:

- The deposit of **\$200** is due at the time of registration is **non-refundable**. Registration closes Nov. 1, 2018 (or earlier if the tour is full).
- Final Payment is due by Dec. 1, 2018
- 25 % of total tour cost will be charged if cancellation occurs 30-45 days prior to departure
- 50 % of total tour cost will be charged if cancellation occurs 15-30 days prior to departure
- 100 % of total tour cost will be charged if cancellation occurs 15-0 days prior to departure

### DOCUMENTS

A valid passport is required with an expiry date at least **six months** after date of returning home. It is the passenger's responsibility to obtain, at their own expense, the documents required to enter Israel according to citizenship.

### TRAVEL INSURANCE

You should purchase **medical insurance** valid in Israel for the duration of your tour. In addition we recommend that you purchase **travel insurance**, which should cover your expenses in case of cancellation due to health and other issues.
