Course Description

This course will survey the views of the resurrection of Jesus in scripture, Jewish history, and modern scholarship. It will interact with a number of disciplines, including ancient history, theology, the 'historical Jesus,' Jewish-Christian relations, and apologetics.

Course Goals

- 1. Present a historical overview of Jewish beliefs about the concept of resurrection
- 2. Examine the factors that have changed Jewish beliefs in this area over the centuries
- 3. Discuss the historicity of the resurrection of Jesus within the above parameters

Learning Outcome

- 1. The student will understand the historical landscape of both Jewish and Christian thought on this issue.
- 2. The student will learn to integrate and decipher modern critical responses to the historicity of the resurrection of Jesus.
- 3. The student will become familiar with contemporary literature on the resurrection.

Course Structure

The lessons will be held through a Zoom format, consisting of lectures and interactive discussions between all participants. There will be 10 three-hour live zoom lectures (with breaks). Recordings will be available to registered students.
