DAY-BY-DAY SCHEDULE

0	Feb. 15 (Saturday)	Those flying from North America, depart for your transatlantic flight	Enroute
1	Feb. 16 (Sunday)	Arrive in Tel Aviv. Please choose flights that arrive before 3pm, in order to join the group bus to your hotel in Samaria.	Eshel Hashomron Hotel, Ariel or similar



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2	Feb. 17 (Monday)	Visit a factory in the nearby industrial zone to learn about Israeli-Palestinian coexistence in the workplace. Visit Shiloh (including the audio-visual), where the tabernacle stood in the days of the Judges and Hannah prayed for a son (I Sam 1-3). Tour Mt. Gerizim (John 4), stopping at the Samaritan Museum (John 4) and enjoying a panoramic view over the Palestinian city of Nablus (biblical Shechem). In the late afternoon enjoy a stroll through the Biblical Garden at the hotel, which reminds us of various Biblical events that happened in Samaria. After dinner there will be an opportunity to view the night show at the model of the Tabernacle in the hotel garden.	Eshel Hashomron Hotel, Ariel or similar
3	Feb. 18 (Tuesday)	Begin the day with a panoramic view over the coastal plain from the hills of Samaria, to learn about the strategic advantage of holding the heights above Tel Aviv. Tour the Israel College of the Bible and ONE FOR ISRAEL media studios. Hear the testimonies of Jewish and Arab staff members and have lunch with the the faculty and staff (included) . Head north along the Mediterranean coast to visit Caesarea – Herod's magnificent port city, where the centurion Cornelius heard the good news (Acts 10) and Paul gave his defense before the Roman rulers and King Agrippa II (Acts 24 and 26).	Haifa, Colony Hotel or similar
4	Feb. 19 (Wed)	Visit a home for Holocaust Survivors . Continue to Mt . Carmel where the Prophet Elijah had a contest with the prophets of Baal (I Kings 18). Tour the archaeological ruins of the ancient town of Megiddo , a key city which Solomon fortified and then continue to Nazareth Village, a reenactment of life in Nazareth at the time of Yeshua. Stop in Nazareth for a	Sea of Galilee, Maagan Eden or similar

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		panoramic view over the city and a meeting with a local Arab pastor .	
5	Feb 20 (Thursday)	Sail on the Sea of Galilee. See the remains of the 1 st century AD fishing boat that has become known as the "Jesus Boat". Enjoy a panoramic view of the lake from the Mount of Beatitudes. Visit sites connected with the ministry of Yeshua around the Sea of Galilee, such as Tabgha , to remember the breakfast on the beach following the resurrection (John 21) and Capernaum, a Jewish fishing town which became Jesus' ministry base. Share a fish lunch together by the Sea of Galilee (included). There will be an opportunity to be baptized in the Jordan River. End the day with a visit to the archaeological excavations at Magdala, a Jewish town with a synagogue from the first century	Sea of Galilee, Maagan Eden or similar
6	Feb 21 (Friday)	Visit the northern border, with a stop at Misgav Am , with its impressive view into Lebanon. Meet with soldiers guarding the border there. Tour Tel Dan , one of the two alternative sites of worship built by King Jeroboam. for a view into Lebanon. Tour Caesarea Philippi (Matt 16:13ff) and then ascend the Golan Heights for a view into Syria and time of teaching/prayer.	Sea of Galilee, Maagan Eden or similar
7	Feb 22 (Saturday)	Travel down the Jordan Valley, stopping at the Decapolis city of Scythopolis (Biblical Beth Shean), with its impressive Roman/Byzantine ruins. Descend to the Dead Sea the lowest point on earth. Pass Jericho and the area of the Judean Wilderness where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered. Visit the oasis of Ein Gedi (1 Sam 24 – David hides from Saul) and	Sergei Palace or Prima Kings, Jerusalem, or similar



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explore Herod's spectacular mountain fortress, Masada. There will be an opportunity to float in the **Dead Sea**. Then UP TO JERUSALEM! We'll have our first view over the city from Mt. Scopus. Travel to Bethlehem where we'll visit the "Shepherds' 8 Feb 23 Sergei Palace, or Prima (Sunday) Fields" and also meet with a Palestinian pastor to learn about Kings, his ministry and pray for his congregation. Time permitting, Jerusalem, or there will be a visit to a local **olive wood shop.** Travel through similar the Judean Hill Country to the Valley of David and Goliath. Visit Emmaus (Acts 24) and attend service at a local congregation led Dr. Seth Postell of the Israel College of the Bible. On the way back to Jerusalem, stop at Yad Hashmonah, a Messianic Jewish community in the Hill country. Feb 24 Ascend **Temple Mount**, the site of the two temples. Tour the Sergei Palace, 9 or Prima (Monday) excavations around the Southern Steps of Temple Mount and Kings, learn about pilgrimage to Jerusalem at the time of Jesus in the Jerusalem, or Davidson Center. Visit the City of David, including similar Hezekiah's water tunnel [or the (dry) Canaanite Tunnel], the Pool of Siloam, and the audio visual. Sergei Palace, 10 Feb 25 Visit Yad Vashem, the Holocaust Memorial Museum, where or Prima (Tuesday) we'll be privileged to have a local guide show us through the Kings, main museum. Visit the model of Second Temple Period Jerusalem, or Jerusalem at the Israel Museum and the Dead Sea similar Scrolls exhibit. Have a time of prayer over the city at one of Jerusalem's prayer centers. In the evening, there will be an



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optional evening excursion to the amazing Sound and Light Show at the Tower of David. 11 Feb 26 Say farewell to the city with a panoramic view from **the Mount** (Wednesday) of Olives, the location of Jesus' ascent and return, and **Dominus Flevit** where He wept over the city of Jerusalem (Luke 19:41-44). Spend time at the Garden of Gethsemane where Jesus prayed His last prayer with His disciples. Tour the archaeological remains in St. Peter in Gallicantu to No hotel remember the trial of Jesus before Caiaphas and then visit the included for **Garden Tomb**, a peaceful place to reflect on the crucifixion and this night resurrection of the Lord. The rest of the afternoon is free to visit Mahane Yehuda market or browse the Old City Bazaars. We'll have a farewell dinner together and then transfer to the airport for your flight home

- A non-refundable deposit of **\$300** per person, paid online, to Israel College of the Bible is required to secure registration. You will be directed to the payment site at the end of registration.
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PAYMENT AND CANCELLATION PENALTIES

- Final Payment should be made by Nov 14, 2024
- 25% of the cost of the tour will be charged if you cancel after Nov 15, 2024
- 50 % of total tour cost will be charged if you cancel after Dec 15, 2024
- 100 % of total tour cost will be charged if cancellation occurs after Jan 15, 2025

DOCUMENTS
